

The principles of classical education are grounded in the belief that education should be focused on the development of the whole person, rather than simply the acquisition of knowledge or skills. The focus is less on learning facts and memorizing information for the purpose of achieving acceptable grades on standardized tests, but more on learning how to learn, how to think deeply, and how to seek out solutions to problems. Critical thinking and curiosity are encouraged. The "great books" are celebrated and devoured. The study of Latin isn't just about learning the language, it's about learning its connection to the Church and to other languages. The Catholic Classical student is curious, asks questions, and approaches the exciting journey of learning with a sense of wonder.



St.Brigid of Ireland By: Elise Collins

Brigid was the daughter of an Irish clan chief and an enslaved Christian woman. She, too, was also a slave for eighteen years.

On her eighteenth birthday, she stopped working for her father and became a disciple of St.Patrick. Her father told her to get married, but she said that she would spend her life working for God by looking after poor, sick, and elderly people. Brigid founded several monasteries as well as a school of art that taught metalwork and illumination. Brigid is thought to have died on February 1, 524, when she was in her early seventies.

Brigid is the patron saint of midwives, newborns, nuns, fugitives, blacksmiths, dairymaids, boatmen, chicken farmers, cattle, scholars, and sailors. In fact, she is the only female patron saint of Ireland! There is a special cross named after St. Brigid that is woven from reeds or grasses.


LEARNING ECONOMICS
