St.Perpetua was born in Carthage, North Africa in the second century. When Perpetua was 22 she



While she was in prison her baby daughter was able to be with her for a short time. Later they beheaded her with a sword because the wild beasts in the arena didn't kill her. St. Perpetua died in Rome on March 7, 203. St. Felicity was friends with St. Perpetua and also became a Christian. Felicity was pregnant and her baby was born while she was in jail with Perpetua and some other Christians. Since Felicity couldn't keep her baby, some other secret Christians adopted her child. She died with St.




St.Joseph By: Elise Collins
