option! These purchases will continue to help you earn money off tuition for the 2024-2025 school year.

<u>FUTURE NOTE REMINDER</u>: Physical cards for Scrip will run from September 1, 2023-April 5, 2024. The May Scrip order rebate for physical cards rebate amount will go towards the following-following year (ex: 2025-2026 school year). So, tuition rebate amounts during the 2023-2024 school year will run from April 8, 2023-April 5, 2024.

# WHAT HAPPENS AT THE EASTER TRIDUUM? WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

THE EASTER TRIDUUM CONSISTS OF HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, HOLY SATURDAY, AND EASTER SUNDAY. ON HOLY THURSDAY, JESUS HAS HIS LAST SUPPER WITH HIS DISCIPLES. HE WASHES HIS DISCIPLES' FEET, SHOWING THAT HE CAME DOWN TO EARTH NOT TO BE SERVED, BUT TO SERVE. JESUS BROKE THE BREAD, GAVE IT TO THE DISCIPLES, AND PERFORMED THE FIRST-EVER MASS. HE EVEN REVEALED WHO WOULD SOON BETRAY HIM AND DENY HIM! THEREFORE, HOLY THURSDAY IS SO IMPORTANT. GOOD FRIDAY IS THE CELEBRATION OF JESUS' DYING FOR OUR SINS.
