Want to catch up on a few things in this newsletter. First, the great response we had on the family survey. Many people had so many positive things to say about the job our teaching staff is doing communicating with parents. From the survey the communication is two-way. Please continue to reach out to your child's teacher when every you have questions or concerns.

On the issue of communications with me in the office. I can see there is more work to be done. I will try to be more responsive. One thing parents deserve is a quick turn around when they email me. I will work on this. Please, keep me to this promise. If I do not respond back to you by the next day when you email me, please call, text or email me again asking why.

Parents had some questions about specials at Saint Patrick School and how these are chosen. This is a great question, and the answer simple. Our Specials are provided by Airport Community Schools. We call this service, "Shared-Time". Airport is allowed to support us with teachers in non-academic subjects that they offer to their school children of the same age level. There are several things that play into this, like our class sizes, the number of teachers employed by airport in an area, and the time of day the teacher is available. Airport is supporting several non-public schools with a limited staff, and at no cost to Saint Patrick School. Working out the schedule with all these schools is a real feat. When there is the availability, sometimes we get an extra day of PE or two music teachers (like this year, one for the older grades and another for the younger students). There have been times when Spanish was available and other times when we get shorted. I am grateful for the way the administration at Airport Community Schools works with us to meet our needs.

After school pickup seems to be going well. Please remember to make three (and if needed four) lines as you come into the lot, and merge these into one as you make that first turn by the ballfields. Please be aware of who is behind you and if there are cars on Exeter, be the one to make the third or fourth lane.

Our average time clearing the parking lot has been 15 minutes!

Finally, I'd like to announce that Saint Patrick School is now able to offer tutoring at no cost to families who might like a little extra support. These tutors are available after school. If you are interested in reading or math support, please contact the office.



RAISE RIGHT (SCRIP)

As we start the second half of our school year, now is a great time to get started! Quick reminder that family and non-family members can also use the St. Patrick Scrip Program. It's super easy! They simply fill out a Scrip form that can either be emailed or picked up and turned in at the school office. Then, download the RaiseRight app to their phone or go to raiseright.com, create an account using St. Patrick's School enrollment ID 62d487a4446, link a bank account or credit card and start shopping. There are physical gift cards (some are reloadable; ex. Meijer) and egift card options.

As always, physical Scrip orders are placed at 12:00 pm the first Friday of each month and typically ready to be sent home with students or picked up the following Wednesday. You can also use the online gift cards for instant use! This program is so wonderful because with every purchase there is a percentage that is given back to St. Patrick School. While you are purchasing everyday items, you are simultaneously fundraising for St. Patrick School.

ST. VALENTINE

THE STORY OF ST. VALENTINE BEGINS IN ROME WITH A SIMPLE CHRISTIAN PRIEST NAMED VALENTINE. HE WOULD PERFORM MARRIAGE CEREMONIES IN SECRET EVEN THOUGH IT WASN'T ALLOWED. PEOPLE WHO WERE PLANNING TO GET MARRIED WOULD BECOME AFRAID BECAUSE CLAUDIUS THE SECOND SENT OUT A DECREE THAT WHOEVER GOT MARRIED WOULD BE THROWN INTO PRISON AND PUNISHED. BUT THAT DIDN'T STOP ST. VALENTINE.
