#### **PRINCIPAL'S NOTE**

#### March 2023 Edition

Here we are revving up for the final push to June! A fantastic winter; more sunny than cloudy, warmer than most with more ice than snow! It is mid-March, and the year has progressed.

Star Test scores will be coming come your way soon. Please review these results with your children. Especially in the lower grade, reviewing math facts at home (such as one- and two-digit addition and subtraction, as well as multiplication facts through 12) can make a huge impact on your children's ability to grow math magically! Reading is also a major key to success. Since this is reading month, you should see your children reading more at home, trying to reach their personal reading goals. March is almost over, now is an excellent time to make 30 minutes of reading each day, at home, a regular part of your children's daily routine. The more they read, the faster and easier reading gets!

When my kids were young, Jan and I would read aloud to the family in the evening. We tried to spend a minimum of 30 minutes a day as a family reading. As the kids grew, the older ones would take turns reading out loud to the rest of us. After a while we were enjoying the time so much the 30 minutes grew to a chapter or two a night. Even now, when my oldest daughter comes home for a visit, her favorite thing to do is to sit by the fireplace or under a tree, with her dad, taking turns reading to each other. Sadly, these times are fewer and fewer, but very precious to us both.

We are also halfway through Lent. Students started our Lent off with an Ash Wednesday with Bishop Battersby. The whole school attended Mass and then sang a beautiful song for the Bishop. They also created a beautiful Shamrock-Spiritual bouquet of prayers and sacrifices offered up for the Bishop.

I will close this note with an observation. This year we have made it a push at Saint Patrick School to teach the students several very special prayers. We say these prayers every day in our prayer time in the morning. By now, every student, from kindergarten through eighth grade should know these prayers by heart. Occasionally, I'll talk to a student about these prayers. I'll ask a question like, "Hey, do you ever say our morning prayers at home, on weekends or when we have a long break?" Often the answer is, "No." Sometimes they ask me, "Should we be saying them at home?" Morning prayer is so important. Children should be in the habit of greeting our LORD every morning as they rise and offer their day to Him. Another person who should hear your child's prayer is her/his Guardian Angel. Our Guardian Angels stand before the throne of God and by our side. They are there as divine protectors of each of us (even Moms and Dads). They never leave our side. All too often we forget they are there, and don't call on them to help us. Why not get into the habit of saying morning prayers with your children every day (if you are not already doing so)? We can never give up praying for them and over them!

Finally, don't forget the power of the Sign of the Cross. By making the Sign of the Cross, we profess the central truths of our faith: that God became one of us, with a human body and soul, and that He died on the cross to save us. When we sign the cross over our body and say the word of blessing, we drive away demons, receive a powerful protection against the demons and are renewed in our own weak nature. God bless you all!

# RAISE RIGHT ( SCRIP)

We are down to only two Scrip orders left for physical cards for the 2022-2023 school year. I will be turning in tuition amounts for everyone that participated, to Kelly after the May order so that she can get that into the FACTS system to reflect your tuition for the 2023-2024 school year. Wow, did this school year go by fast! I just want to encourage everyone to still use Scrip during the summer months through your Raise Right App. Think about using e-Scrip when you are purchasing plants or gardening items from Lowe's or at Target and other similar stores when buying spring and summer clothing, even uniform shopping! This will continue to help you earn money off tuition for the 2024-2025 school year (whoa, that sounds crazy to say) for items you would be buying anyways!

**FUTURE NOTE:** A couple changes that will be coming for Scrip next school year is that Scrip will not be mandatory, only encouraged. Physical cards for Scrip will run from September 1, 2023-April 5, 2024. They will continue to be placed at 12:00 pm, the first Friday of each month with the goal of them being sent home with the eldest student the following Wednesday. I will place a May Scrip order for physical cards however, that rebate amount will go towards the following-following year (ex: 2025-2026 school year). The reason for this is to help with getting tuition rebate amounts to the office for FACTS purposes. This will hopefully help alleviate the last-minute invoicing for the next school year's tuition. So, tuition rebate amounts during the 2023-2024 school year will run from April 8, 2023-April 5, 2024.

THE STORY OF ST. PATRICK BEGINS WITH A 16-YEAR-OLD BOY NAMED PATRICK. HE WAS BORN IN GREAT BRITAIN A.D. 387. HE WAS KIDNAPPED BY PIRATES AND SOLD TO A TRIBAL CHIEFTAIN NAMED MILCHU. HE had to attend to sheep for 6 years as a slave working for Milchu. One NIGHT WHEN ST. PATRICK WAS SIFEPING. AN ANGEL APPEARED TO HIM AND SAID "PATRICK. GET UP AND FLEE FROM YOUR MASTER. THERE IS A SHIP WAITING FOR YOU TO GO BACK TO BRITAIN." SO, HE GOT UP AS SOON AS THE ANGEL SAID THIS and ran 200 miles to get to the boat. After many days of travel St PATRICK REACHED HOME AND LIVED HAPPILY FOR MANY YEARS BUT ONE DAY PATRICK RECEIVED ANOTHER VISION FROM GOD. IN THIS VISION ST PATRICK was told to go back to Irfland as a Missionary. After St Patrick was ordained as a priest, he was sent on a mission to teach Christians in IRFIAND AND CONVERT THE IRISH.
